**Mike Adams** – Major League Baseball, 5 years. An infielder like his father Bobby Adams, Mike played all infield positions. He played for the Twins, Cubs and Oakland A's.

**Skip Adams** – Baseball Player. Skip is the son of Mike Adams. He plays third base and was with the San Diego Padres.

**Steve Ansel** – Entertainment. Steve is lead singer for the Jackson Street Band.

**Jeff Bajenaru** – Major League Baseball, 3 years. Jeff went to the University of Oklahoma where he was an All American. He pitched for the White Sox and Diamondbacks.

**Michael Bankston** – National Football League, 8 years. This defensive end played for the Arizona Cardinals and Cincinnati Bengals. He recorded 621 tackles and 27 sacks during his career.

**Ethan Blackaby** – Major League Baseball, 2 years. Blackie was a left hander who played for the Milwaukee Braves.

**Chad Brown** – Chad is an Actor, Poker Player and Color Commentator. His winnings total over \$3,000,000 and he won the 2009 Gulf Coast Poker Championship. He was the 2006 Poker Player of the Year.

**Leon Brown** – Major League Baseball, 1 year. Leon was an outstanding outfielder with great speed and played for the New York Mets.

**Byron Browne, Jr.** – Major League Baseball. Byron was a right handed pitcher with the Milwaukee Brewers.

**Byron Browne, Sr.** – Major League Baseball, 8 years. Downtown Byron Browne was a right handed hitting outfielder who played for 4 different teams.

**Jason Christiansen** – Major League Baseball, 11 years. A left handed pitcher from Nebraska, Jason pitched for 4 teams in the Major Leagues.

**Jeff Cook** – National Basketball Association, 8 years. A forward–center that played for the Suns, Kings, Cavaliers and Jazz. He was the 3rd round pick of the Kansas City Kings in the 1978 draft.

**Danny Davis** – Radio. Danny is a long time valley radio voice currently on KOY Radio.

**Kory DeHaan** – Major League Baseball, 2 years. A left handed hitting outfielder that played for the Padres.

**Duffy Dyer** – Major League Baseball, 13 years. Duffy was a catcher. He was a member of the Arizona State National Championship team in 1965 and played for the World Champion Mets in 1969.

**Ron Gardin** – National Football League. A defensive back and kick returner who went to the University of Arizona and then the Baltimore Colts where he played in and won Super Bowl V.

**Jerry Hairston** – Major League Baseball, 15 years. An outfielder with the White Sox Jerry had a .258 lifetime batting average. His father and son both played in the major leagues.

**Jack Heideman** – Major League Baseball, 8 years. Jack was an infielder who played with the Indians, Cardinals, Mets and Brewers.

**Gene Hiser** – Major League Baseball, 5 years. Gene played outfield for the Chicago Cubs.

**Jason Hiser** – Major League Baseball. Jason was an infielder with the Chicago Cubs.

**Billy Horton** – Baseball Player. Billy was a catcher and played for the Cleveland Indians.

**Garry Jestadt** – Major League Baseball, 3 years. A right handed infielder who played for the Expos, Cubs and Padres.

**Dave Kingman** – Major League Baseball, 15 years. His 442 home runs ranks him 38 All Time. He was a 3 time All Star and 2 time Home Run Champion.

**Kevin Kobel** – Major League Baseball, 6 years. Kevin pitched for the Brewers and Mets and has a 3.88 lifetime ERA.

**Albie Lopez** – Major League Baseball, 11 years. A right handed pitcher who played for the World Series Champion Arizona Diamondbacks in 2001.

**Jim Marshall** – Major League Baseball, 5 years. Jim played for the Orioles, Cubs, Giants, Mets and Pirates. He was an original member of the Mets and also managed the Cubs and A's.

**Jamie McAndrew** – Major League Baseball, 2 years. Jamie was a right handed pitcher that played for the Milwaukee Brewers.

**Jim McAndrew** – Major League Baseball, 7 years. Jim was a right handed pitcher who played for the Mets and Padres.

**Elvin Nina** – Baseball Player. Elvin pitched professionally for 9 years including the Diamondbacks organization in 2005.

**Kevin O'Donnell** – Poker Professional. He is the owner of K O'Donnell's in North Scottsdale. He has won over one million dollars as a professional poker player.

**Gaylord Perry** – Major League Baseball, 22 years. A right handed pitcher who won the Cy Young Award in both the American and National League. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1991. He had 314 wins, 3,534 strike outs and a lifetime 3.10 ERA. He had 53 shutouts, 303 complete games and pitched 5,351 innings. He was a 5 time All Star and threw a no hitter in 1968.

**Tony Phillips** – Major League Baseball, 18 years. A switch hitter who played many positions. He led the American League in runs in 1992 and walks in 1993 and 1996. He was a member of the 1989 World Champion Oakland A's.

**Ken Rudolph** – Major League Baseball, 9 years. A right handed catcher who played for 4 teams including the 1969 Chicago Cubs.

**Doug Schaefer** – Baseball Player, 4 years. Doug was a right handed pitcher in the San Francisco Giants organization. He went to the University of Oklahoma.

**Al Schmelz** – Major League Baseball, 1 year. A right handed pitcher who played on the 1965 Arizona State National Championship team.

**Buddy Schultz** – Major League Baseball, 5 years. A left handed pitcher, Buddy holds the NCAA record for most strikeouts in a 9 inning game, 26.

**Phil Seibel** – Major League Baseball, 1 year. Phil was a pitcher who played for Team USA in 1999 and was a member of the 2004 World Champion Boston Red Sox.

**Mike Sember** – Major League Baseball, 2 years. Mike played third base from 1977–1978 for the Chicago Cubs.

**Lee Smith** – Major League Baseball, 18 years. Lee pitched in over 1,000 games and has a lifetime 3.03 ERA. He was a 7 time All Star and his 478 saves places in 3rd on the All Time list.

**Greg Steen** – Baseball Player. Greg was an infielder for the California Angels.

**Bob Welch** – Major League Baseball, 17 years. Bob was the last pitcher to win 27 games in a season. He was a 2 time All Star and won the 1990 Cy Young. He was on three World Championship Teams, 1981 Dodgers, 1989 A's and the 2001 D'Backs.

**Curt Young** – Major League Baseball, 10 years. Curt is currently the pitching coach for the Oakland A's. This left handed pitcher played for the 1989 World Champion Oakland A's.

**Larry Yount** – Major League Baseball, 1 year. A right handed pitcher who played for the Houston Astros and has been a Board Member of Directors of Arizona Baseball Charities since its inception.

**Bart Zeller** – Major League Baseball. Bart began his Major League baseball career in 1970 with the St. Louis Cardinals. This catcher donates to numerous charities.
